DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS FOR DIOCESAN and MBS

TUITION ASSISTANCE IS MARCH 1, 2019

The Diocese of Wilmington has been accepting tuition assistance applications for the 2019-2020 school year since December 2018. Tuition assistance through the Diocese of Wilmington is provided to children attending grades K-12. Last year 7 of our families qualified and received over \$28,000.00 in tuition support.

To be considered for assistance, parents must submit an online application before March 1st, to FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment for evaluation at <u>www.online.factsmgt.com/aid.</u> FACTS representatives are available to guide parents through the application process and to answer any questions at 1-866-441-4637. Pre-school, before and after care are not funded through this program.

Completed applications, including all supporting documentation such as tax forms are due March 1st. Applications that are submitted <u>after that date will NOT be</u> <u>considered for assistance.</u>

PLEASE REMEMBER: ALL families who wish to be considered for MBS assistance must complete and submit the FACTS application.

We remain in full swing of the Flu season. Symptoms of the flu may be abrupt fever that can last 3-4 days, complaints of feeling achy and having the chills and unusual weakness and fatigue. If your child is ill and you suspect the flu, please have the child evaluated by their physician. Children who test positive for the flu virus are usually out of school for a week. If you do not have your child evaluated and they return to school too early, you are putting your child at risk for contacting other viruses and exposing other school children to the flu virus. If your child tests positive for the flu, please notify the school nurse before the student returns to school. As always, we recommend thorough hand washing, getting enough sleep and eating

correctly to help your body fight any infection.



COUNSELING CORNER

This week I worked with grades K - 5. I visited each class to do a lesson on stress, worry, anger, body cues and coping skills or chill skills. We discussed, as a class, what kinds of things worry us, stress us out or make us mad. We then shared what feelings we have due to those worries and stress. We talked about how our body gives us signals to alert us when we are stressed. For example, we may get a worried belly, a headache, our heart may pound faster, our face may get hot and so forth. Once we recognize the body cue it is important that we then use a calming skill. We talked about our breathing as a way to begin the calm down process. We discussed several helpful hints to help us breathe, such us, smell the flower, blow out the candle and square breathing. We discussed many other ideas to calm or "chill". Examples given by our students include, praying, talking to our trusted adults, exercising, counting to 20, moving away from the situation, tensing/releasing, journaling, listening to music and so on. Grades 3-5 wrote notes during our lesson. K-3 will come home with handouts on Thursday. Parents, please review this with your children, practice these skills, model these skills and let's all take a deep breath!


School Safety

In our ongoing efforts to provide a safe and secure learning and working environment, M.B.S. continues to move forward in steps of preparation and environmental safeguards.

On Tuesday, our students and recess supervisors held a reverse fire drill. This drill involves a fog horn sound and the students immediately line up to enter the building. This measure is planned for possible cases of potential threats outside the building (chemical spills, at-large suspects, etc.). Our students did very well during

the drill.

In addition, our school has been awarded an \$8,000.00 grant from the State of Maryland to be utilized in upgrading the preparedness of our facility. The grant will be dedicated to installing bollards (barriers) at the front and side entrances of our facility that would prevent a vehicle from being driven through the doors. These structures will be removable (with a key) in case there is a legitimate reason for a vehicle to approach and park at the entrances.

BLIZZARD BAGS

In anticipation of inclement weather and subsequent unsafe road conditions that would cause us to close school, our school has implemented the "Blizzard Bags" program. Children will bring home their Blizzard Bags that contain assignments to be completed on those days on which school is closed for weather related reasons. Each child is expected to complete the assigned work and return it to his/her teacher when school resumes. In doing so, we will not be required to "make-up" the days missed. It is very important that all students complete the assignments as provided. Your cooperation in assuring that assignments are completed is very much appreciated. If a student has difficulty with an assignment, the parent is asked to communicate with the child's teacher so that guidance may be provided and additional time for completion will be given. Thank you!
