#### **SUMMER WORK**

"Summer slide" refers to the regression in skills that many children experience during the summer months. All summer work is expected to be completed when students return to school in September. Students will or have been given a paper copy of the summer work assignments. In addition, all summer work will be posted on the school website after July 1st.

It is very important that you inform the school if you change from one parish to another at any time during the year. Thank you.


## **LOST ITEMS**
