**BLESSING OF THE ANIMALS** 



Today, October 3rd at 2:20 p.m. our school will host a Blessing of the Animals prayer service on the school lawn adjacent to the Prayer Garden. Students will be dismissed by their teacher following the prayer service.

We ask all visitors and their animal friends to stay behind the yellow tape before, during and after the service.

# Dismissal Procedures for Friday, October 4th-Fall Festival

In order to provide a safe and orderly dismissal on Friday, October 4th, we are asking that everyone please cooperate with the following:

- Children who attend-after care will report to after-care as usual. Parents of those children should pick up their children following the usual procedure from the after-care room. If someone other than the parent is picking children up, proper notification must be made in advance and identification may be required.
- Children whose parents wish to pick-up and then attend the Fall Festival will be available for pick-up in the cafeteria at dismissal time.
- Parents should come to the cafeteria where the children must be signed-out in order to pick-up.
- Children must be signed out by the parent. If someone other than the parent is picking children up, proper notification must be made in advance and identification may be required.

- It is important that all children are picked-up from the cafeteria by 3:30 p.m. Children who are not picked-up from the cafeteria by 3:30 p.m. will be taken to the after-care room.
- Parents arriving for pick-up after 3:30 p.m. will be billed for after-care services.
- Bus dismissal and departure will proceed as usual from the front of the school building.
- Car line dismissal will take place as usual with one exception. As cars exit the school parking lot, drivers will be directed to do so through the St. John Neumann parking lot. Exiting cars will not be able to exit onto rte. 589 via the front driveway of the school.
- Volunteers who arrive at MBS before 2:30 p.m. are asked to please park in the parking lot behind the school.
- Anyone arriving after 2:30 p.m. is asked to park in the St. John Neumann parking lot.
- Guests attending the Fall Festival should park in the St. John Neumann parking lot. Parking in the school parking lots will not be available during the Fall Festival.

# FROM THE HEALTH ROOM

Many children are struggling with the changes and the routine of school. Students are presenting with headaches and stomach pains and fatigue. Please encourage healthy eating. Good grades, a good attitude and a good day at school all start with breakfast. Our children need a chance for food to wake them up and fuel their brains and bodies to learn and stay healthy. Hydration is also key for success. Studies show proper hydration does more than just quench your thirst. It helps our cells carry oxygen and nutrients which keep us healthy and alert. When the body is dehydrated it can cause the brain to temporarily shrink causing headaches. Students may bring a water bottle with them to school. There are several water stations for refills in our school. Sleep is important for success in school as well. Guidelines from the American Academy of Pediatrics state that children age 6-12 are recommended to get 9 to 12 hours of sleep at night and students aged 13-18 years old need 8 to 10 hours of sleep every night. Children who get enough sleep have a healthier immune system, better school performance, better behavior and mental health. Encourage your students to eat well, stay hydrated and get plenty of rest at night.

- 3. Check in with Ms. Higgins in the front office
- 4. Sign out the players who will be riding in your car
- 5. Make sure the players in your car have all their belongings
- 6. Accompany and supervise the players at the host facility until a coach has arrived
