## St. Jude The Apostle

St Jude The Apostle Church is honored to have Holocaust survivor Ann Jaffe, who will speak on November 7, at 1:30 pm in our Parish Life Center. All are welcome to attend.

Ann Jaffe is a retired teacher connecting with young people by speaking as a firsthand witness and survivor of the Holocaust. She chairs the Speakers' Bureau of Delaware's Holocaust Education Committee and has presented her story, and the lessons from it, over 400 times. She inspires and influences countless individuals.

Born in 1931 in the small village of Kobylnik, Poland (now Belarus), her family survived by hiding from the Nazis for two years in a nearby forest. Ann endured exposure to freezing temperatures, starvation, and constant fear of capture. She credits her parents for her survival, and the life lesson she shares with others, "to never hate your fellow man."

A s a Holocaust educator, she advocates for tolerance and respect for differences, while encouraging individuals to speak out against injustice. For these reasons, Ann was also honored by the Anti-Defamation League last year at the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC.
