- Afternoon Car Line: Please turn off your car until it's time to go.
- We will be unable to have rainy day dismissals as done in the past. Students will be dismissed as usual. If rain or snow is in the forecast, please make sure your child is dressed for the weather.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the teachers and staff for all their hard work and dedication over the summer. They have worked diligently preparing classrooms, facilities, adding additional maintenance to their list of things to do, training, ordering, attending professional development, being here and helping all summer and so much more.

And finally, thank you to our eight sponsoring parish priests. Thank you for your words of encouragement and support, not just financially but also spiritually, you are our beacons of light.

I would like to take this opportunity to emphasize some key points in our return to school plan:

- All parents are responsible to health screen their children before coming to school each day. This includes temperature checks. When in doubt, stay home.
- Masks are to be worn all day, inside and out. Mask may be lowered to drink and to eat. When outside, they may remove their mask when sitting down, distanced.
- Hygiene is important through washing hands and sanitizing. Take advantage of our dispensers inside and outside of our building.
- Sharing water is not permitted. All students must bring their own bottle and drink lots of water throughout the day. Once your water is consumed, we will refill your bottle. Water fountains are not available.
- For safety reasons, our health suite will utilize both of our rooms; one for ill children and one for well children. If your child is being sent home, we ask you pick up within one hour of our call.

We have a great plan in place. Please help us to continue to implement our plan and talk about the plan with your children. For the safety of all, remind them of the importance of these procedures and that good plans do work!

We have made some changes to our MBS staff and teachers these past two weeks and I would like to share these with you. Welcome to the following new employees: Mrs. Casie Petrik is our pre-K 4 assistant, Ms. Cathy Gallagher is our kindergarten assistant and Mrs. Michelle Udinski is our second-grade assistant. They have all been a part of our MBS community as parents, and we greet them with open arms to our teaching staff!

Also, we have made some changes to current employee, Mrs. Kathleen Meisten is our second-grade teacher, Mrs. Waegele has moved to third grade, Mrs. Kristen Littleton is our technology coordinator and Mrs. Sherry Brannon is working with Mrs. Josie Cover to facilitate arts integration this year. Again, we welcome our new employees and continue to support our current employees in their new positions.

In keeping with the Diocesan theme for the 2020-2021 school year, Called to Serve, MBS will have a N.U.T. Day (No Uniform Today) on Friday, September 25, 2020. We are asking each student to donate two can goods, or more, of non-perishable items. We are all called to serve this month, incorporating the Corporal Works of Mercy, by feeding the hungry. We will help supply depleting pantries of our eight sponsoring parishes, beginning this month with St. Mary Star of the Sea/Holy Savior Church.
