Catholic Identity-Easter Triduum

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum - from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten Season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are

- Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion
- Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord

Holy Thursday

The evening Mass on Holy Thursday is referred to as *The Mass of the Lord's Supper*. This is where the Church re-lives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "alter of repose," a place where the consecrated Host is kept, away from the main alter where Mass is normally celebrated.

Many parishes will create space for people to stay and pray with the reposed Eucharist at the alter of repose late into the night, remembering Jesus' request in the Garden of Gethsemane for someone to "watch and pray" with Him.

Good Friday

Good Friday is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence. This is the day of the crucifixion, the day Jesus died for the sins of the world.

The parish alter looks very different on Good Friday: it is plain and bare. There is no consecration Host in the tabernacle at the main alter of the church; it was carried away on Holy Thursday night to the "alter of repose" to signify Jesus' death. The candle by the tabernacle is blown out, and the tabernacle doors are left open to show that it is empty. Jesus is gone. This is quite dramatic, reminding us that Good Friday is a solemn day of mourning and prayer.

The ceremony on Good Friday is not a Mass-it is a communion of service using the consecrated hosts from Holy Thursday. Good Friday is the only day of the year on which Masses not are offered.

Holy Saturday

The Easter Vigil is held where RCIA candidates are welcomed in to the Catholic Church by receiving Sacraments of Intent.

Easter Sunday

Resurrection of our Lord.


Updated Daily Health Assessment
