Next week we begin our journey through Lent. This 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture, serve by giving alms, and practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. The teachers will spend time with the students preparing them for this journey and reminding them of the importance of our acts of preparation. The students will have the opportunity to witness the burying of the Alleluia, participate in the Sacrament of Confession, perform service activities, and pray the Rosary and the Stations of the Cross to grow closer to Christ during this season of Lent.
